

Inspire Girls 5 Resources

US and African students have the opportunity to co-develop one of the five following teacher resources to inspire African girls pursuing careers in technology:

- 1. After-school girls' tech club**
 - a. Explore ways to make technology more inclusive of girls, helping them overcome barriers and develop confidence
 - b. Assist in the development of other resources, computer refurbishing, etc.
 - c. Involve not just students, but also the greater community (e.g. mothers, community and business volunteers, online mentors)
- 2. Professional development**
 - a. Develop training programs for new teachers
 - b. Work with EdTech Summit to adapt their teacher tech content and Internet training materials to the needs of African teachers
 - c. Include WiderNet's Coding for Girls program
- 3. Apps and games**
 - a. Develop apps and games to make STEM and coding education more engaging and accessible to girls in developing countries
- 4. Digital content**
 - a. Improve the [educational content](#) pre-loaded in WCE's refurbished computers by expanding the curriculum involving girl's STEM education
- 5. Student experiential-learning project**
 - a. Work with African [iEARN](#) coordinators to develop a project about girl empowerment in technology. The project will be posted on the global iEARN platform and accessible to all 2 million participating iEARN students.
